# **ECONOMICS 197: Supervised Field Study (Internship Credit)**

Supervised Field Study credit is for **internship** work relevant to your major. A faculty sponsor, a complete proposal, and a written report at the end of the term are required (see below). ECON 197 must be taken on a Pass/No Pass basis. Field study, independent research, and similar non-lecture courses do not fulfill upperdivision course requirements in the major.

Note: No more than a total of 4 units of 197, 198, and 199 courses may be taken in one semester. No more than 16 units of 99, 197, 198, 199 courses may be used to meet the requirement of a bachelor's degree.

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To enroll in ECON 197, you must meet ALL of the following prerequisites:

- Declared in the Economics major
- Have a minimum GPA of 2.0 in both the major and overall courses
- Have an internship that can be demonstrably related to the Economics major. Internships unrelated to
  economics will not be approved.

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\*\*International students interested in obtaining approval for <u>Curricular Practical Training (CPT)</u> must *first* be approved for ECON 197 in order to obtain CPT approval.\*\*

If you meet the requirements stated above to be eligible for enrollment in ECON 197, please complete the application on page 2. Internships are subject to approval by the Undergraduate Committee. The deadline to submit this application with the required attachments is 4pm (PT) on Friday of the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of classes in the semester you wish to enroll. For the summer, the deadline is the end of the first week of Session C.

**Please submit your application via the google form.** We recommend submitting your application early to avoid any delays.

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If your internship requires that you earn academic credit and you are not able to arrange it through UC Berkeley, you may want to check with California Community Colleges. Community colleges may offer academic credit for internships in the form of cooperative education programs or classes in the appropriate departments. This may be an easier and more economical alternative.

**Be Informed!** The US Department of Labor released a statement in 2010 clarifying employer's and college's roles under federal law: https://www.dol.gov/whd/regs/compliance/whdfs71.htm. See "Unpaid Interns & the Fair Labor Standards Act," http://www.natlawreview.com/article/unpaid-interns-and-fair-labor-standards-act, *National Law Review* June 2015. At issue is that some private companies take advantage of "free labor" and exploit interns, or that employers do not want to assume liability for interns. Some employers have insisted that students receive academic credit for unpaid internships, in part to show compliance with legal standards.
